

1 [Youth Commission Support and Co-sponsorship of TAY SF's SF4TAY.ORG Resource Website and
2 Launch Event]

4 At its regular meeting of May 21, 2012, the San Francisco Youth Commission unanimously adopted
5 the following motion:

7 The San Francisco Youth Commission supports TAYSF's SF4TAY resource website and will help with
8 outreach; the San Francisco Youth Commission will cosponsor the SF4TAY resource website launch
9 event in June 2012.

11 Supplemental information

12 The 2006 Transitional Youth Task Force identified the need to increase outreach and awareness
13 efforts to better connect transitional age youth with existing programs and services. There are few
14 access points that advertise or refer youth to multiple services. TAY and service providers often have a
15 hard time finding resources because they are not in one comprehensive place. Printed guides often
16 become outdated as soon as they are printed, as CBOs or programs may move, change contact
17 information, or go out of business. Current guides and websites often do not contain resources
18 specifically designed for TAY. A TAY only website is needed to maximize the resources that exist in
19 the community.

21 SF4TAY.org will be a comprehensive, one stop access and referral TAY resource website specifically
22 for TAY and their supporters. This searchable resource directory will allow young adults to easily
23 access information in order to connect with the range of local resources that are available to them.
24 Services in workforce, education, housing, wellness, advocacy and recreation will be listed on one
25 central site. The SF4TAY.org site will go live during a launch event in June 2012.

1 The Youth Commission will be actively involved in promoting, and doing outreach for both the website
2 and launch event.
