1	[Resolution urging the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to support the establishment of
2	required LGBT cultural competency trainings for caregivers of foster youth (AB 1856)]
3	Resolution urging the Mayor and San Francisco Board of Supervisors and the Mayor to
4	support Assembly Bill 1856, which would require caregivers of foster youth to be
5	trained in cultural competency and best practices for providing adequate care for
6	Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Queer and Questioning LGBTQQ youth.
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8	WHEREAS, Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Queer and Questioning (LGBTQQ)
9	youth are more susceptible to harassment, violence, and discrimination than their straight
10	counterparts ; and,
11	
12	WHEREAS, 26% of LGBTQQ youth are forced to leave their families of origin as a
13	result of conflicts with their parents regarding their sexual orientation or gender identity. Many
14	of these LGBTQQ youth end up on the street, but some go to foster homes; ¹ and
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16	WHEREAS, There are very few studies of LGBTQQ foster youth, but one study in New
17	York City found that: 100% of LGBTQQ youth in New York City group homes reported that
18	they were verbally harassed on the basis of their sexual orientation or gender identity while at
19	their group home, 70% reported physical violence due to their sexual orientation or gender
20	identity; ² and
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22	WHEREAS, 78% were removed or ran away from their foster placements as a result of

1	hostility toward their sexual orientation or gender identity. 56% spent time living on the streets
2	because they felt "safer" there than they did living in their group or foster home; ³ and
3	
4	WHEREAS, 78% of LGBTQ foster youth don't feel safe in their group homes because
5	of their gender identity and/or sexual orientation (2); ⁴ and
6	
7	WHEREAS, LGBTQQ foster youth face a great deal of disadvantages, under the law
8	they deserve equal access to services; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, AB 1865 (Ammiano), which is currently being considered by the California
11	State Legislature, would require existing training programs for caregivers of foster youth to
12	include cultural competency training to best meet the needs of LGBTQQ foster youth; now,
13	therefore, be it
14	
15	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission urges Mayor Lee and the
16	Board of Supervisors to support AB 1865, such that providers of foster youth can be
17	adequately trained to meet the unique needs of LGBTQQ foster youth.
