2	Resolution establishing the San Francisco Youth of the Year Award, given to 13 young people
3	who have demonstrated exceptional leadership and outstanding civic engagement in his or her
4	community, and the subsequent Award Ceremony to be held on November 20, 2012.
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6	WHEREAS, As stated in Article IV of the San Francisco Charter, Section 4.124, it is the duty of
7	the Youth Commission to "identify the concerns and needs of the children and youth of San
8	Francisco;" and
9	WHEREAS, Children and youth are often a lost voice in communities, overlooked and
10	discouraged to contribute; and
11	WHEREAS, Even when young people do get involved, their efforts often go uncelebrated and
12	unrewarded; and
13	WHEREAS, It is very important to empower young people to contribute to their communities,
14	as these young people are the next generation of law makers and community activists; and
15	WHEREAS, the San Francisco Youth Commission has identified the need for the
16	encouragement and empowerment of youth to contribute to their community; and
17	WHEREAS, Section 4.124 further states that it is the duty of the San Francisco Youth
18	Commission to " identify the unmet needs of San Francisco's children and youth through personal
19	contact with these young people;" and
20	WHEREAS, Personal contact with San Francisco's young people is often hindered by general
21	ignorance of the existence and purpose of the Youth Commission; and
22	WHEREAS, Further outreach about the Youth Commission is necessary to foster the "personal
23	contact" mandated by the charter; and
24	WHEREAS, Section 4.124 further states that another duty of the Commission is to "elicit the
25	interest, support, and mutual cooperation of private groups (such as fraternal orders, service clubs,

associations, churches, businesses, and youth organizations);" and
WHEREAS, Outreach (and the subsequent awareness of the Commission's existence and
purpose brought on by outreach) is often insufficient to elicit the ongoing interest and cooperation of
private groups; and
WHEREAS, An incentive is needed for such private groups to maintain a relationship with the
Youth Commission and to refer engaged youth to the Youth Commission; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission hereby establishes the San Francisco
Youth of the Year Award, to be given to 13 young San Franciscan residents (ages 12-23) who have
demonstrated exceptional leadership and outstanding civic engagement in his or her community; and
be it further
RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth of the Year Award will be given to one person from
each Supervisorial District, in addition to two other young people from the city at large; and be it further
RESOLVED, That the Award Ceremony for the SF Youth of the Year Award will take place at
4:00 on November 20, 2012, during a regularly scheduled Board of Supervisors meeting; and be it
further
RESOLVED, That the Youth Commission will distribute flyers for, and in other ways promote,
this award through outreach to various community organizations; and be it further
RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission cordially invites all nominations for
people who qualify under the aforementioned requirements, and will continue to accept nominations
until November 1, 2012; and be it finally
RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission urges the Board of the Supervisors,
the Department of Children Youth and their Families, the Board of Education and the Mayor to
promote this award and to encourage young people to submit nominations.
