1) What communities do you feel connected to and why? How would you represent the diversity of youth in the City and County of San Francisco? (Examples: Queer, Disabled, Homeless, Teen Parent, Low-Income, Immigrant). You are not limited to these choices. Please add your own.)

Growing up in Chinatown, my entire family lived in a small, one-room rented apartment. With the heater always running at minimum capacity during winter and constant journeys to Goodwill, every year required a rationalized struggle to live. While my situation was grueling, it is a pervasive one throughout my community. Many of the families in Chinatown live on the border of the poverty line and are forced to prioritize everything around the bare necessities for living instead of seeking out the medical attention that they need. As a result, the preservation of health and wellness is often overlooked for more immediate concerns. Medical conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure are often neglected and prevalent throughout the community. By seeing and experiencing the struggles around me everyday, I am passionately driven and motivated to work hard, so that one day, I can return to my community and bring people the need and care that they deserve.

2) What special skills, insight and experiences would you bring to this position?

I feel that I would fill the position with many strengths. My strengths are interpersonal skills and influencing skills. I understand people very well and can usually convince them to agree with my point of view by acknowledging credibility and being purposeful. I have good judgment about people and an intuitive sense of their talents and their ability to contribute to a given problem. I enjoy listening to other people and am not afraid to collaborate on ideas. I am also a very flexible person and strive to be successful in everything that I do.

While I generally like the education system we have today, I do recognize that there are some flaws in our school's approach to learning. The approach of learning in high school is centered around a test after a specific session or lesson on a given topic. The problem arises when students receive their tests back. While some students do well, others do not. Those who do not do so well wonder why they did not obtain a better score and want to learn from their mistakes. When it comes time to review the test, teachers do not spend enough time reviewing and teaching the lessons where students struggle the most. Students are then not given the opportunity to completely understand each topic before moving on to the next. Since most advanced topics are built upon previous lessons, students who have not built a solid understanding of the fundamentals are likely to continue to suffer a repeated cycle of "failure" as the discrepancy between the level of understanding among the students increase as the semester progresses. This issue can easily be monitored and adjusted by introducing a new set of standards for school education usage or a program for teens struggling in their curriculum courses.

3) What are some of your past experiences as a participant or leader in youth-focused activities?

As the co-founder and co-president of an entrepreneur club, DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America), I lead group discussions on recent news in business, entrepreneurship, marketing and finance. Since my high school does not offer business courses, DECA serves as a club to attract motivated students to share their ideas in business. My particular interest is in the effects of marketing and finance on a business. Although I have never taken a course on these topics, my experience as the leader of DECA provided many opportunities to hone in on my speaking and presentation skills while advancing myself in techniques of entrepreneurship. By evaluating case studies with students from diverse backgrounds, I was able to gain a new perspective on how

the various components of business such as finance, marketing and strategy play critical roles in the overall business.

In my early years of life, I had to go through school with a speech disability. I was a very shy kid and was always brought to meet with a counselor for one-on-one speech therapy during my lunchtimes. Over time, I learned to be more confident, enough to talk to students around me and respond to teachers who would ask me questions in class. I felt very appreciative of that counselor who talked with me every day and made me feel comfortable talking to other human beings. Nowadays, I apply my own learnings from experience to kids with social and educational problems. At my community YMCA, I help tutor seven to ten year-olds in literacy. I try to make them feel comfortable in surroundings without their parents while learning to read and write. As a result of incorporating their daily life schedule and any problems or concerns they have during group discussions and story time, the coherency in their speech and writing skills throughout the semester have significantly improved.
