Motion supporting the efforts to end the California American Legion's ban on 3 girls' participation in the national program and urging the Mayor, Board of 4 Supervisors, and San Francisco's members of the State Legislature to support. 5 6 WHEREAS, The California American Legion's Boys and Girls State ("Boys and 7 Girls State") program, which is an immersive mock government program designed to 8 promote civic engagement in California and is part of a nationwide network of programs, 9 currently prohibits female participants who should be eligible to represent the state at the national American Legion Boys Nation ("Boys Nation"); and 10 11 WHEREAS, In 2023, Boys and Girls State delegates elected a girl to represent California as our Lieutenant Governor to Boys Nation, yet she was not permitted to 12 attend on the basis of her gender; and 13 14 WHEREAS. After the election results showed a delegate would not be able to attend on the basis of her gender, a boy was instead selected to attend instead; and 15 WHEREAS, The adult leadership of Boys and Girls State have repeatedly 16 17 refused to adopt equal rules for all participants, no matter their gender; and 18 WHEREAS, This blatant gender discrimination is unacceptable and actively 19 stops girls across California from gaining equal access to leadership positions; and 20 WHEREAS, Advocates for changing this discriminatory policy have called for state leaders, particularly members of the California Assembly and California Senate 21 22 Education Committees, to work to address this policy; and
